3. Has there been a recall on this seat? *		
4. Has this car seat been in a crash, even a minor one? * Are there any stress marks (light-colored) or cracks in the plastic or broken foam pieces under the fabric?		

If you answered YES to any of the questions above, the seat may not be safe for use and should be disposed of properly.

*NHTSA DEFINES MINOR CRASHES AS ONES WHERE: THE VEHICLE WAS ABLE TO BE DRIVEN AWAY FROM THE CRASH SITE, THE VEHICLE DOOR NEAREST THE CAR SEAT WAS NOT DAMAGED, NONE OF THE PASSENGERS IN THE VEHICLE SUSTAINED ANY INJURIES IN THE CRASH, IF THE VEHICLE HAS AIR BAGS, THE AIR BAGS DID NOT DEPLOY DURING THE CRASH; AND THERE IS NO VISIBLE DAMAGE TO THE CAR SEAT. (NHTSA.GOV) SOME CAR SEAT MANUFACTURERS (GRACO ESPECIALLY) ARE A REPLACE AFTER ANY CRASH, INCLUDING MINOR ONES.
